SMALL GROUP STUDY QUESTIONS

- 1. What part of Mary's story surprised or encouraged you the most?
- 2. Where do you sense God working quietly in your life right now?
- 3. What prevents us from noticing God in the ordinary?
- 4. What is one area God is calling you to surrender to Him?
- 5. How do you discern the difference between fear and divine calling?
- 6. How can the church support one another in responding with Mary-like obedience?

PERSONAL REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- 1. Do I prefer big, visible moments with God rather than quiet, hidden ones? Why?
- 2. What fear do I need to name before I can obey?
- 3. Where is the Holy Spirit inviting me to trust beyond my understanding?
- 4. What small act of obedience can I practice today?
- 5. How might my quiet yes impact others in ways I may never see?

FAMILY DISCIPLESHIP GUIDE

Ask:

- 1. Why is Mary important to this story?
- 2. What does it mean to say "yes" to God?
- 3. How can we follow Jesus in small ways each day?

Activity: Light a small candle. Explain that Jesus came quietly like this small flame. Turn off the lights and see how even a tiny light fills the room. Thank Jesus for coming close to us.

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After reading the passage together, ask:

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
